



OHS 2023-24 Elementary Teacher of the Year *Branham Smith*

Congratulations to Branham Smith from Northside Intermediate School on being chosen as the OCS 2023-24 Elementary Teacher of the Year! Branham has been teaching third grade at Northside for the past five years and has just been selected as the Instructional Coach for the school.

Growing up in Charlotte, NC, Branham Smith loved school and always had the feeling she wanted to be a teacher. She is the oldest of four girls and “playing school” was the norm at her house. However, it wasn’t a teacher that helped her make that decision, but a friend from the bus named Frank. According to Smith, he wanted to be a bus driver when he grew up. She soon realized that in Frank’s world, the bus driver was the person that made sure Frank got his homework done and made sure he was at school each day. “It doesn’t just take a teacher to make a positive impact

on a child’s life,” said Smith. “It takes the bus drivers, the cafeteria workers, the counselors, the office staff. It takes everyone.” When Branham realized what an impact she could have as a teacher, she knew she had found her path. “We’re so lucky to spend eight hours a day with our students. It’s a role that I don’t take lightly.”

According to Smith, one of the most important aspects of being a good teacher is building relationships. “Relationships are so important,” said Smith. “The relationships we have with our students are vitally important, but so are the relationships we have with our co-workers and school family.” Connections with her students and their families are also important. “It’s great to be out on the weekend and see my students. I enjoy meeting their families and getting to know them outside of school.”

Smith said that her dad gave her some good advice that she tries to pass on to her students. “I want my students to understand that they are a reflection of their family and class members and that their actions speak volumes.” Based on the love she has for her students, and the love that her students have for her, it sounds like Mrs. Smith can be confident that her actions speak volumes in the best possible way.

Branham and her husband Brad are proud parents of Bradley, who will be one year old in March. Most of their free time is spent focused on enjoying every moment with their daughter. They are members of First Presbyterian Church in Opelika.



OHS 2023-24 Secondary Teacher of the Year *Mandy Baker*

Congratulations to Mandy Baker from Opelika High School on being chosen as the OCS 2023-24 Secondary Teacher of the Year! Mandy has been teaching Education and Training at Opelika High School for the past seven years. Even though Mandy always wanted to be a teacher, her path took a few turns before she landed in the classroom. Originally from Gadsden, AL, she always played school and loved to babysit. She was always the teacher, and her sister was always the student. Two of her main influences growing up were Peggy Gilbert, her home economics teacher at General Forest Middle School, and Glenda Hicks, the librarian. "They both showed me that education was about more than just what was being taught each day, it was also about the relationships that you create with your students," said Baker. "I think it is important to teach them the course material, but it is also important to help them learn life skills."

Since being hired at Opelika High, Baker has helped build an extremely successful Education and Training Program at OHS. Students in Mrs. Baker's class learn the fundamentals of teaching, classroom management, lesson planning, and how to work with children. Having Pre-K classrooms on campus at OHS has provided "amazing experience for our students" according to Baker. "Our students are able to get hands-on experience in a true classroom setting every day without having to leave our school campus. It helps our students confirm that they want to be in education or decide that they want to follow another path."

When asked about her favorite part of teaching, Baker talked about the relationships she has with her students. "I love to get to know them, to help them learn, and to help them succeed," said Baker. "I love watching them go out into the world and find what they want to do." Even if her students decide not to go into the education field, Mrs. Baker hopes she teaches them skills to help them be successful. Regardless of their future plans, Baker wants to make sure that her students know she is there for them. "I want them to know that I will help them with whatever they need. I'm here." Whether her students hear the familiar phrase as they step into her classroom on the first day of school, or after they have graduated, they know they can count on Mrs. Baker to guide them.

"We are incredibly excited to welcome Coach Moore and his family back to Opelika," said Kelli Fischer, OHS Principal. "Coach Moore has proven himself as a quality head coach, but what is even more impressive is his ability to establish relationships with players, coaches, and the community where he works."



Moore was the head football coach at Hartselle High School from January 2020 to December 2023. Prior to that, he was the head football coach at Jasper High School (2018-2020) and at Eufaula High School (2015-2018). His coaching career began at Opelika High School in 2007 as the 9th grade football assistant coach and the 9th grade head basketball coach. After being the 9th grade head football coach in 2008, he was the tight ends/inside wide receivers coach from 2009-2011. He then served as varsity offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach from 2011 until March 2015. "I am so honored to be the new head football coach at Opelika High School. It's surreal to have the opportunity to come back and lead a program that I began coaching in many years ago," said Coach Moore. "Opelika has always been a special place to me and my family. It's where I got my start in teaching and coaching and where my kids were born. My desire for this program is for it to be the best football program in Alabama."

Coach Moore graduated from Auburn University in May 2007 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Social Science Education. He received a Master's Degree in Coaching and Athletic Administration from Concordia University in 2018. He and his wife Lindsey are the proud parents of three boys: Parker (age 13), Baker (age 10), and Tucker (age 7).


